Activities:

- 1. **Movie Inspiration**: Show short clips from movies like *Rocky* and discuss how the characters in the film show determination, perseverance, and empowerment. Ask students what qualities they admire in these characters and how they can apply similar traits in their own lives.
- 2. **Role Model Discussion**: Introduce the students to Bruce Lee, Sonny Liston, Rocky, and Apollo Creed. Discuss why these individuals are considered good role models and how their characteristics can inspire young people to achieve their goals. Encourage students to think about who their role models are and why.
- 3. **Representation Collage**: Provide magazines, newspapers, and art supplies for students to create a collage depicting diverse representations of individuals in various fields, including boxing. Discuss the importance of representation and how seeing diverse role models can empower young people.
- 4. **Introspective Writing**: Ask students to write a short journal entry reflecting on a time when they felt empowered or inspired. Encourage them to think about how they can empower themselves and others through their actions and choices.
